The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has completed its investigation of the Water Supply identified above, which is located approximately 906 feet from a gas well that Hilcorp Energy Company drilled, [REDACTED]

Samples from the Water Supply were collected by a qualified third party, and submitted to Pennsylvania-accredited laboratories for analysis. Based on the analytical results of samples taken from February 9, 2012, to June 12, 2013, DEP has determined that the Water Supply was affected by nearby gas drilling well activities. Specifically, there was turbidity, iron, manganese, and headspace gas shown to be present in your water supply above predrill levels.

However, based upon the analytical results of the samples taken on November 8, 2012, DEP has determined that the effect on the Water Supply was temporary, and that the Water Supply quality has returned to pre-drill levels or is now at or below the applicable Maximum Contaminant Levels under the Pennsylvania Safe Drinking Water Act.


