This letter is regarding your water supply. The Department's investigation indicates that oil and gas activities polluted the Water Supply. This information is summarized below.

At this time, the Department's investigation has determined that your Water Supply has been impacted by historic oil or gas well drilling, altering, or operating, or site construction activities, however, a specific source was not able to be identified. It is likely the source of the methane and other pollutants present in your water supply are due to abandoned wells drilled in the 1950's. One (1) of the abandoned wells has been located and will be plugged as part of the Department's Orphan and Abandoned Well Plugging Program. Should additional abandoned wells be located, the Department will add them to the Orphan and Abandoned Well Plugging Program for future plugging contracts.


