The Department has investigated the possible degradation of your water supply located at [REDACTED]

On August 18, 2014 and September 25, 2014, the Department collected samples from your home water supply. The samples were submitted to the Department's laboratory in Harrisburg for analysis. The analytical reports for the samples are included.

From our investigation, it appeared that drill cuttings contaminated your water well during drilling operations conducted by New Horizon Oil Company while in the process of drilling [REDACTED] well. Water samples were taken on August 18, 2014 and again on September 25, 2014. Test results from the samples taken on August 18, 2014 showed elevated concentrations of iron, manganese, sodium, and chlorides. On September 25, 2014, the department resampled your water supply to confirm the initial findings. The test results were received on October 21, 2014 and showed that the iron, manganese, Sodium and Chlorides were back down to pre-drill levels or within drinking water standards.


At this time, although your water well was temporarily impacted, the Department's investigation does not indicate that oil and gas well drilling has had any long term effect on your water supply.
